

MUNICIPAL ELECTIONS • SUNDAY, NOVEMBER 7, 2021

PUBLIC NOTICE

To sole owners of an immovable, sole occupants of a business establishment, undivided co-owners of an immovable and co-occupants of a business establishment, concerning the general election on November 7, 2021, in Montréal

NOTICE is given to sole owners of an immovable and sole occupants of a business establishment who are not already entitled to be entered on the list of electors as domiciled persons, that they must meet the following conditions to be entered on the list of electors of Montréal:

- 1. be 18 or over on **November 7, 2021**;
- on September 1, 2021, be a natural person, a Canadian citizen and neither be under curatorship nor under any conviction for an offence constituting a corrupt electoral practice;
- on September 1, 2021, have been the sole owner of an immovable or the sole occupant of a business establishment on the territory of Montréal for at least 12 months;
- have filed with the returning officer, at the address shown below, an application for entry on the list of electors of Montréal, by October 1, 2021, at 4:30 p.m.

Sole owners and occupants who wish to withdraw from the electoral list the existing entry, shall transmit to the returning officer, at the address shown below, a signed writing requesting the withdrawal by **October 1, 2021, at 4:30 p.m.**

NOTICE is also given to undivided co-owners of an immovable and co-occupants of a business establishment who are not already entitled to be entered on the list of electors as domiciled persons, as sole owners of an immovable or as sole occupants of a business establishment, that they must meet the following conditions to be entered on the list of electors of Montréal:

- 1. be 18 or over on November 7, 2021;
- on September 1, 2021, be a natural person, a Canadian citizen and neither be under curatorship nor under any conviction for an offence constituting a corrupt electoral practice;
- on September 1, 2021, have been the undivided co-owner of an immovable or the co-occupant of a business establishment on the territory of Montréal for at least 12 months;
- have been designated under a power of attorney signed by the majority of co-owners or co-occupants who are qualified to vote on **September 1, 2021**;
- have filed a power of attorney with the returning officer, at the address shown below, by October 1, 2021, at 4:30 p.m.

Co-owners and co-occupants who wish to replace the existing designation shall transmit to the returning officer, at the address shown below, a new power of attorney by October 1, 2021, at 4:30 p.m.

An application for entry, withdrawal or a power of attorney filed after October 1, 2021, at 4:30 p.m., but no I ater than October 18, 2021, at 7 p.m., the last day to file an application with the board of revisors, will be considered as an application for correction to the list of electors, and consequently, will be submitted to the board of revisors.

Applications for entry and power of attorney forms are available from the returning officer or on the website.

Applications for entry and powers of attorney take effect on receipt and remain valid as long as they are not withdrawn or replaced.

6. Exceptional measures related to the health situation (vote by mail – COVID-19)

You will have the opportunity to vote by mail if you are in one of the following situation, you must comply with a request or recommendation for isolation from public health authorities because you:

Between Sunday October 17, 2021 and Wednesday October 27, 2021

- returned from a trip abroad within the last 14 days;
- were diagnosed with COVID-19 and you are still considered a carrier of the disease;
 - are showing COVID-19 symptoms;
- have been in contact with a suspected, probable or confirmed case of COVID-19 within the last 14 days;
- are waiting for a COVID-19 test result.

To vote by mail, eligible electors must make a verbal or written request to the returning officer no later than October 27, 2021. The ballot papers for voting by mail will be sent as of October 11. If you are registered to vote by mail and you have not received your ballot papers a few days after their sending, you can contact the returning officer to obtain new ones.

Ballot papers must be received at the office of the returning officer no later than Friday, November 5, 2021, at 4:30 p.m. If you are requesting to vote by mail because you must comply with an order or a recommendation from public health authorities to isolate, your request will be valid for the current poll only. Your application will be valid for the current poll.
